

Aloysius John C. Riehle

JOHN C. RIEHIE, fourth child and second son of MARTIN and MAGDALENA (OCHS) RIEHLE was born 22 June 1867 on his father's farm at the corner of Newton and South Abbott Roads in East Hamburg, (now Orchard Park) New York. Although throughout his life, John Riehle used the middle initial "C", his baptism recorded at Sts. Peter & Paul Church in Hamburg, New York, lists his baptismal name as John George Riehle. He was baptised 21 July 1867; his godparents were GEORGE RIEHLE and MARY ANN OCHS. He married 26 May 1891 at St. Peter & Paul Church in Hamburg to JOSEPHINE ANGELA PETRIE [she was born 6 September 1867 at East Hamburg, NY, daughter of JOHN and CAROLINE (STOCK) PETRIE; died 12 December 1947 Hamburg, NY; buried 15 Dec St. Peter & Paul Cemetery, Hamburg.]

On 24 December 1896, five years after his marriage, John Riehle purchased one of his father's farms which was located on the South Abbott Road about one-half mile from the farm where he was born. This was an important milestone in his life as evidenced by an entry in his personal journal which states, "On the 25th day of December on the Christmas Night, I got the farm of my father for Two Thousand Dollars." The deed recorded in Erie County Liber of Deeds 853, page 132, on 19 October 1897 is from MARTIN and MAGDALENA

This land was described as "51 Acres - the Sout
west corner of Lot #36, 9th Twp., 7th Range,"
and is dated 24 December 1896. A later entry in
his journal shows how John Riehle enlarged his
farm by purchasing adjoining acreage. "Bought t
farm of 50 Acres in the year of 1902." A deed
dated 1 July 1902 from MARTIN and MAGDALENA
RIEHLE to JOHN RIEHLE covering 50 Acres - the
Southeast portion of Lot 36, 9th Twp., 7th Rang
was recorded in Erie County Book 951, page 283,
on 8 December 1902.

At one time John Riehle was struck by a trolley in the city of Buffalo while he was taking load of produce to market. His journal records "28 October, struck by trolley in City of Buffalo. 19 November, cast put on. 19 January, cast off. 23 January, cast on again." As a result, he is said to have suffered from back—continued on page 2, column 1...


Referred to by his children as "a stern man", he was not without a sense of humor. He loved people, parties and festivities. One of his favorite excuses for a party was a "shivaree", which was a surprise visit to a married couple shortly after they were settled into their new nome. John and his friends would bring kettles, norns, bells - anything that would make a great leal of noise and "seranade" the newly-married couple until they responded by offering food and

John enjoyed telling stories to his grandchildren about the early days. One of these stories concerned his Riehle cousins from Clermont County, Dhio. It was the custom among the New York and Ohio Riehle families to visit each other on their noneymoon trips. On one occasion when a newlywed couple arrived in East Hamburg, John showed them around his farm. A small out-building, which was ised for a storage shed for wood and as a catchall for almost everything, had been fitted up by John with a single cot in the corner, complete with old and tattered blankets and pillow. John cold the newlyweds that this was where they were to stay. Only this unknown couple from Ohio could tell us of their horrified reaction.

His more serious side was evidenced by his devotion to his religion; he served for some time is a trustee of St. Peter & Paul Church in Hamburg He was an excellent craftsman, especially in woodworking. He made various pieces of furniture, one of which was a child's cupboard for doll dishes, which is still in the possession of a grandaugher's family. He held strong political opinions, but apparently never ran for or was elected to a public office. Always keeping abreast of current events, ne frequently helped a grandson with his current-

Upon his retirement from farming, John and his wife moved into the village of Hamburg, residing on Union Street where John Riehle died on 5 October 1940 at age 73. He was buried 8 October at St. Peter & Paul Cemetery in Hamburg.

The children of JOHN and JOSEPHINE (PETRIE) RIEHLE were:

- 1. CLARENCE JOHN RIEHLE, born 6 September 1892; died age 67, 4 August 1960; buried 8 August at St. Peter & Paul Cemetery; married GERTRUDE S. GURNEY (she was born 1891; died 1953). They had issue - 2 children, a son and a daughter.
- 2. ALOYSIUS WILLIAM RIEHLE, born 15 August 1894; died age 65, 30 January 1960 Buffalo, NY; bur. 3 February at Nativity of Our Lord Cemetery, Orchard Park, NY; married 21 April 1925 to MARY STANG [she was born 8 September 1895 at Buffalo, daughter of FRANK and BARBARA A. (SPECHT) STANG; died 24 February 1972; buried with her husband.] They had issue - 5 children 2 sons and 3 daughters.
- 3. MATILDA MARY "TILLIE" RIEHLE, born 31 October 1896; married 16 May 1917 in Hamburg, NY to GEORGE JOSEPH BIELMANN [he was born 24 June 1893, son of JOSEPH and GENEVIEVE (SCHNEIDER) BIELMANN; died 18 January 1963 Buffalo; buried 21 January at Lackawanna, NY.] Mrs. Bielmann now resides in Buffalo, age 87 years. They had issue - 13 children, 8 sons and 5 daughters.
- 4. EDWIN NICHOLAS RIEHLE, born 3 November 1898; died age 72, 16 August 1971 at Ft. Lauderdale, Florida; buried there; married 16 October 1924 to CLARA MARY GATES [she was born 4 Augus 1906 at East Eden, NY, daughter of JOSEPH and LILLIAN (DOLE) GATES; died 4 April 1975; burie with her husband.] They had issue-2 daughters.


